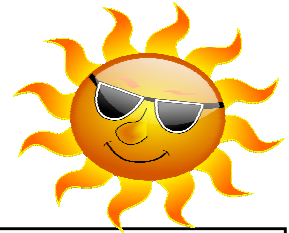

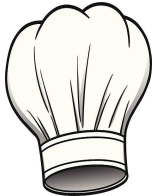

SCAM BEWARE In Suffolk residents are being contacted out of the blue by individuals claiming to be from O2. The caller advised that the resident was eligible for a reduction in their monthly bill and that they would receive a watch as a gift. After confirming personal and financial details the caller advised that the gift would be received in the post. Shortly after the resident received a package. The parcel contained a new mobile phone, rather than the promised watch. The resident called on the number they had been given and an address was provided to send the mobile phone to, with the guarantee to reimburse the cost of postage. Sadly, the resident soon discovered they had been a victim of fraudsters impersonating O2, when they received messages indicating their Apple ID was being used on a new iPhone. A further check on their account and they discovered a new contract for a mobile phone had been taken out in their name. What you need to do: • Cold calls about mobile upgrades and contracts - If you're unsure that the person calling you is an official representative of the company they claim to be from, hang up and do not reveal any personal information. • Only contact your mobile network provider on a number you know to be correct. For example, 191 for Vodafone customers, 150 for EE customers, 333 for Three customers, 202 for O2 customers, 4455 for Tesco Mobile, 789 for Virgin Mobile and 150 for Sky Mobile. • If you receive a device that you did not order or expect, contact the genuine sender immediately. The details for this will be within the parcel. • NEVER post a device directly to a given address. All genuine Mobile Network Operators would send out a jiffy bag for you to return without you incurring additional cost.

Kentwell Hall is Suffolk's hidden gem and one of England's finest Tudor houses that stands within the most extensive moat in the county and nearly 30 acres of formal gardens and grounds. The house offers the visitor a journey through time from the Great Tudor Kitchen, the Gothic centre block to the State bedroom that was created by Thomas Hopper in the 1820s for a visit from the then Duke of York. Whilst the magnificent Cedar Trees that date back to the late 18th century provide a lovely backdrop & The Sculpted Tree is the UK's biggest single wood carving. See also the lovely wildlife meadows and the Pied Piper Topiary hedge. The Stable Yard Tea Rooms serve light lunches and afternoon tea using seasonal produce from the gardens and farm.

CREAMY CHICKEN IN ONE PAN !
serves 3-4

- 4 oz bacon, chopped into small pieces
- 2 ears corn, frozen or canned (about 2 cups), divided
- 1 1/2 lb, boneless, skinless chicken breasts (about 2), halved lengthwise
- 1 1/4 tsp. ground coriander - 1 tsp. paprika - 1/2 tsp. freshly ground black pepper
- 1 3/4 tsp. salt, divided
- 1 tbsp. unsalted butter
- 1 shallot, chopped - 2 cloves garlic, chopped
- 1/2 cup dry white wine - 1/2 cup double cream - 1/2 cup chicken stock
- 1 oz. mascarpone cheese
- 1 tbsp. chopped fresh coriander
- Lime wedges, for serving (optional)

Step 1
In a large, cold skillet (frying pan), arrange bacon in a single layer. Cook over medium heat, stirring occasionally, until some fat starts to render, 6 to 7 minutes. Add half of corn to skillet and cook, stirring occasionally, until corn starts to brown and bacon is crisp, about 10 minutes more. Transfer to a paper towel-lined plate or bowl.

Step 2
Season chicken all over with dried coriander, paprika, pepper, and 1 1/4 teaspoons salt. In same skillet over medium-high heat, cook chicken, turning occasionally, until golden brown, 2 to 3 minutes per side. Transfer to another plate.

Step 3
In same skillet over medium heat, melt butter. Add shallot and remaining corn and 1/2 teaspoon salt and cook, stirring occasionally, until shallot is slightly softened, about 2 minutes. Add garlic and cook, stirring, until fragrant, about 1 minute more.

Step 4
Add wine and scrape browned bits from bottom of pan. Continue to cook, stirring occasionally, until wine is almost completely evaporated, 2 to 3 minutes. Add cream, stock, and mascarpone. Bring to a simmer and cook, stirring occasionally, until sauce has thickened, 5 to 7 minutes.

Step 5
Add the chicken and any accumulated juices to pan. Top with bacon mixture and sprinkle with fresh coriander. Squeeze a lime wedge over before serving. Serve with spinach and crusty bread.

1 cup = 8oz, 225gms or 250ml

TIPS The corn kernels WILL start to pop as it cooks in the bacon fat. If you have a splatter screen (like one you might use for frying), it will come in handy. If you don't have mascarpone cheese, cream cheese or even sour cream would work well instead.

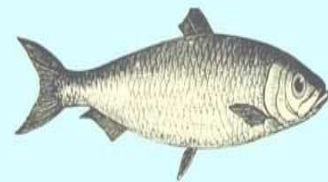
